RE: Investigation by Ecuador regarding an alleged case of IUU fishing

Dear Sir:

Ecuador, a fishing country par excellence committed to cooperation with Regional Fisheries Management Organizations for the sustainable management of bio-resources, reaffirms its commitment with the Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources (CCAMLR) for the regulation of the harvesting and trade of *Dissostichus* spp and other species covered by the Convention.

Ecuador is concerned about a case identified some days ago by the staff of the Vice-Ministry of Aquaculture and Fisheries. As the Convention Members know, Ecuador was recently accepted as a non-Member Cooperating Party by the Commission, and is in the process of implementing the protocols for the certification of catch (taken in the Ecuador Exclusive Economic Zone by vessels flagged to Ecuador) and trade in *Dissostichus* spp. The training of officials and inspectors has not yet been completed. However, a possible case of IUU fishing was identified and the investigation was initiated:

### CASE OF THE CAPE FLOWER

The **Bolivian F/V Cape Flower** submitted a document signed by the **Company BOW S.A.** to the Vice-secretary of Fisheries Resources, requested to the Ecuadorian Fisheries Authority to inspect the vessel in the Port of Manta on **April 12, 2016** with the aim of facilitating the transshipment of the final product destined for the Port of Kaoshiung. The document was sent for analysis to the Compliance Department of the Fisheries Authority and a port inspector was assigned to the case.

The port inspection of the **F/V Cape Flower** was carried out from **April 14 to 15, 2016**, and it confirmed that the catch to be transshipped was four (4) containers with frozen fish / fillets / headed **Dissostichus spp.** Then, and in compliance with the commitments made by Ecuador as a Noncontracting party cooperating with CCAMLR in the implementation of conservation measures regarding fisheries resources it requested the CCAMLR catch certificate from the Bolivian Authority. The investigation led to the following findings:

Also, the Vice Ministry of Aquaculture and Fisheries requested from the Vice-secretary of Ports and Maritime Transport all information and antecedents of the Flag State and companies owning the F/V Cape Flower, and this information is attached to this communication.

Ecuador, as a Cooperating Party, reaffirms its commitment to cooperate with the Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources (CCAMLR) for the regulation of the catch and trade in *Dissostichus* spp and other species regulated by the Convention, and also asks the Commission for instructions and the protocol to be followed in this case.

I should be grateful if you would inform the Members of the Commission as appropriate.

Dear Sir/Madam,

Hereby I want to inform you the RV/Cape Flower with OMI number 7330399 which has been registered under the Bolivian flag on 10 April 2015 has been added to the DRAFT IUU vessel list of SEAFO.

During the annual meeting in November 2017, the SEAFO commission will decide whether to put the vessel on the official IUU list.

Will you be so kind to inform the owner of the vessel of this development.

According to the SEAFO System, the following actions will be taken agains an IUU listed vessel:

- 1. Contracting Parties shall take all necessary measures under their applicable legislation and pursuant to paragraphs 56 and 66 of the IPOA-IUU, to:
  - (a) ensure that its vessels do not participate in any transhipment with, support or re-supply vessels on the IUU Vessel List;
  - (b) ensure that vessels on the IUU Vessel List that enter ports voluntarily are not authorized to land, tranship, refuel or re-supply therein but are inspected upon entry;
  - (c) prohibit the chartering of a vessel on the IUU Vessel List;
  - (d) refuse to grant their flag to vessels on the IUU Vessel List;
  - (e) prohibit commercial transactions, imports, landings and/or transhipment of fisheries















resources covered by the Convention from vessels on the IUU Vessel List;

- (f) encourage traders, importers, transporters and others involved, to refrain from transactions in, and transhipment of, fishery resources covered by the SEAFO Convention caught by vessels on the IUU Vessel List; and
- (g) collect, and exchange with other Contracting Parties, any appropriate information with the aim of searching for, controlling and preventing false import/export certificates for fishery resources covered by the Convention from vessels on the IUU Vessel List.

You can forward any comments to me regarding the issue before the 16th October 2017.

**Ref:** With reference your official letter dated September 19<sup>th</sup>, We express our surprise at the moment to know that your organization pretend include to Bolivian fishing vessel "CAPE FLOWER" to **INDNR** list of SEAFO, without any fault or contravention.

Dear Mrs.

I inform you that the Plurinational State of Bolivia as sovereign country has in its registries to Bolivian fishing vessel "CAPE FLOWER", with OMI number 7330399 and Bolivian Registry number 001/2017, the same one fulfill all regulation and rules of navigation and maritime fishing, in addition has all licenses and permissions issued by the Plurinational State of Bolivia, AS SIGNATORY STATE OF CONVEMAR in accordance with Articles 87, 91 y 94, where Bolivia and its Bolivian Flagged fishing are entitled to prospect, carry out scientific biological studies, logistics and sea fishing on the seas, respecting the 200 miles of the coastal countries, as well as in correspondence to Art. 118 of the UN, as member State and full Country by Right and member not contracting party (NPC) of ICCAT, (attached photocopied copies of the above mentioned documents).

Bolivia and its Maritime and Fishing Authorities respect your Regional Fishing Organization, as well as all existing ones, in this sense We are at your disposal to compare fishing information in the field of maritime biology, meteorological and oceanic that our fishing vessels carry out on the seas, within the legality that protect the Right to free navigation, maritime studies, explorations reasonable fishing sustainable and respectful of the marine environment.

In this sense <u>I am surprised as a Sovereign State</u>, that is to consider <u>Bolivian fishing vessel in the draft list INDR of your Organization</u>, being that this ship complies with all laws, regulations, sea fishing license, registration and respective legal permits for the relevant activities.

I would be very grateful if you would inform me what is the origin of your information that supports this initiative of inclusion and the nature of the facts that originate this initiative or which State inform SEAFO about any misconduct and if it has reliable and legitimate evidence to established international conventions.



I also <u>Urge and Demand</u> as Sovereign State and Member of "CONVEMAR" to <u>be excluded from the draft list of SEAFO INDR</u>, the Bolivian Fishing <u>Vessel "CAPE FLOWER" because it did not commit any offense or contravention to "CONVEMAR" rules.</u>

If this were not the case, an Arbitrariness and Infringement was being committed with the designs of "CONVEMAR", and to Sovereign Right that has the Plurinational State of Bolivia to Free Navigation, Biological Scientific Studies, Logistic and Maritime Fishing in International Waters.

I also inform you that the ship complies with the scientific and logistic studies, training and preparation of Bolivian Navy personnel in relation to Bolivian Maritime Fishing Arts. As well as I clarify that Bolivian Fishing Vessel "CAPE FLOWER" was not registered in Bolivia in 2015, because has its registry before that date.

Through this letter I address to you, with the purpose of give answer to oficial letter REF: SEAFO/IUU/1/2017 dated September 29<sup>th</sup> 2017 received by email, in that regard I inform you that the documents that you attached as evidence of illegality committed by Bolivian Fishing Vessel "Cape Flower" to SEAFO, <u>are legally issued by Bolivian Maritime Authority of Plurinational State of Bolivia</u>, the same ones were submitted to Ecuador Authorities, to enter and dock in the Port of Manta-Ecuador, <u>as evidence of legal activity that carry out the Bolivian Fishing Vessel "CAPE FLOWER" IMO N° 7330399</u>.

These documents were verified for all pertinent Authorities of Ecuador Port State Control (Port Authority, Vice Ministry of Fishing, Customs, Narcotics, Migration, and others). Mentioned Authorities Authorize the transship of fishing products, without any



impediment on the contrary, they endorsed the legality of the ship according to the inspections carried out.

Dear SEAFO Sirs, when trying to include the Bolivian Fishing Vessel "CAPE FLOWER" to INDR list., are violating and restricting the Sovereign Right of the Plurinational State of Bolivia, to carry out Fishing Maritime activities, Biological Research in the seas of the world.

CONVEMAR empowers the Plurinational State of Bolivia as a Signatory State to carry out fishing activities, scientific and biological studies in the High Seas, respecting the 200 nautical miles of the Coastal Countries and in accordance with Art. 118 of the UN, as a Member State of Country full by Right and that is the activity carried out by the fishing vessel "CAPE FLOWER" of Bolivian Flag

The Bolivian Fishing Vessel "CAPE FLOWER" didn't commit any contravention, she sail with all legal and current documents, for the purpose of fulfill her fishing activities, complying with the National and International Laws, Navigation and Fishing Regulations, issued by the Plurinational State of Bolivia, in accordance with the International Maritime Fishing License and Legal and current permits, which details the jurisdictions and areas for fishing in the High Seas, such as being in the jurisdiction of ICCAT. Bolivia as a Non-Contracting Country has the Right to Fish in the Atlantic Ocean and Adjacent Seas, as well as in the CIAT.

<u>Dear SEAFO Sirs where is the ILLEGALITY</u>, all Sovereign States have the right to carry out fishing activities in the seas of the world, without predation of the species, <u>for example Bolivia is fishing 94 tons and New Zealand is fishing over 2.000,00 tons, and other countries are fishing more</u>.

So my question is what country is doing the conservation and management of fish and who the predation?

In this sense I Urge and Demand as Sovereign State and UN, IMO Country Member and "CONVEMAR" to exclude from the draft IUU list of the SEAFO, the Bolivian



# fishing vessel "CAPE FLOWER", because it did not commit any offense and / or contravention to the rules of "CONVEMAR".

I trust that this clarification about legality of documents and of the legal activity carried out by the Bolivian fishing vessel "CAPE FLOWER", could be for a favorable response to remove the Bolivian fishing vessel from the IUU list of SEAFO.
