REPORT OF THE 17TH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE (SCAF)

25 November 2025

1. Opening of the meeting

The Chair, Mr. Wickness Rooifontein (Republic of South Africa) opened the meeting and welcomed all delegates and expressed his wishes for a productive and efficient meeting.

The Republic of South Africa noted that technical support should be available in the physical room for the next hybrid meeting to assist with connection to the online meeting.

2. Appointment of Rapporteur

The Secretariat was appointed as rapporteur for the meeting.

3. Adoption of agenda and meeting arrangements

The agenda (<u>DOC/SCAF/01/2025</u>) was adopted with the addition of Agenda Item 7.3 from the Republic of South Africa on the issue of Capacity building for Contracting Party members (<u>Appendix I</u>).

The Republic of South Africa took note of the ES physical presence in the meeting room and requested that this be standard for all future hybrid meetings.

4. Introduction of Parties' Delegations

The Heads of Delegation introduced their members to SCAF (<u>Appendix II</u>). It was noted that the Republics of Angola and Korea were not represented in the meeting.

5. Presentation of the 2024 Audit Report

The Executive Secretary (ES) presented the 2024 audit report (DOC/SCAF/03/2025) and the Report to Management from the Auditors (DOC/SCAF/04/2025).

SCAF accepted the auditor's opinion that the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of SEAFO as on 31 December 2024, and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the basis of accounting. SCAF also noted that the auditors further reported that the audit evidence they have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for their opinion.

After discussions on the current practice of carry-over of 30 days leave at the end of the leave cycle for Secretariat staff members, the members agreed that the current provision in the SEAFO Staff rules which does not specify for the leave to be taken within a certain time period should remain as is.

<u>ACTION</u>: SCAF agreed to recommend to the Commission to accept the Audited Annual Financial Statements for the 2024 financial year.

6. Presentation of the Executive Secretary's Report on Administration and Finance

The Executive Secretary presented the report on Administration and Finance (DOC/SCAF/05/2025 v1(11 Nov 25)) covering the period from January to September 2025.

Projected cashflow statement shows that with cash equivalents and members' contribution expected, SEAFO will be able to cover all its financial commitments for 2026 with a remaining surplus of N\$ 6,698,573.72 (which excludes the employee benefit reserves and other reserves).

An overview of the financial position of SEAFO was presented for the time from 2005 to the end of 2024. From this the Contracting Parties noted that the Net Worth of SEAFO increased over the past five years up to the end of 2022 and remains more or less the same since then.

The Republic of South Africa congratulated the Executive Secretary on an excellent report and acknowledged the extensive behind-the-scenes work with international organizations that often goes unnoticed.

The Republic of South Africa proposed that all reports related to the Executive Secretary's participation in international meetings and engagements be shared with Heads of Delegation, in line with established practice and for transparency. The Republic of South Africa further suggested that the Secretariat prepare a brief 1–2-page summary for each meeting, outlining the purpose, key outcomes, and relevance to SEAFO. The Republic of South Africa emphasized that formally documenting this work is essential for SEAFO's institutional memory and for ensuring appropriate recognition of the extensive work undertaken by the Secretariat.

ACTION: SCAF noted the report by the ES on Finance and Administration.

7. Any other matters

7.1 Review of the 2016 Performance Review report relevant to SCAF

The ES prepared a document (<u>DOC/SCAF/09/2025</u>) which reviews the outstanding proposals from the 2016 PR relevant to SCAF for discussion as requested by the Commission in 2022. This report addressed long-standing recommendations from SEAFO's 2016 performance review that had remained unresolved for nearly 10 years.

EU indicated that current salary levels are competitive for Namibia/Swakopmund context, suggesting maintaining current rates with annual inflation adjustments rather than adopting UN salary scales. The Committee concluded that existing staff regulations and salary structures are adequate for SEAFO's size.

The Republic of South Africa proposed conducting a new performance review, noting the organization's good financial position (N\$300,000 estimated cost) and emphasizing that nearly 10 years had passed since the last review. Members agreed to terms of reference and a proposed budget to be drafted by the Executive Secretary with member input before the next SCAF meeting.

<u>ACTION:</u> ES to prepare ToR and budget for a new Performance Review of SEAFO and members to give input before the next SCAF meeting.

7.2 Review of the RFMO support of developing countries to attend intersessional and annual meetings.

The ES prepared an overview of practices followed by other RFMOs and presented it to the meeting (DOC/SCAF/10/2025).

The matter was noted by members as an informational item, with the understanding that SEAFO's existing Special Requirements Fund adequately addresses the policy objective, pending future voluntary contributions to make it financially operational again.

7.3 Capacity Building for Contracting Member States

This agenda item was added by the Republic of South Africa to address capacity building needs, particularly inspector training, similar to support previously requested by Angola.

This agenda item was introduced by the Republic South Africa to address capacity-building needs, particularly in inspector training, like support previously requested by Angola.

Republic of South Africa requested that the Executive Secretary engage with the FAO Deep Sea Fisheries (DSF) Project to explore the possibility of financially supporting and hosting training workshops in the Republic of South Africa and Angola, ensuring more equitable capacity building across developing coastal contracting parties.

The Republic of South Africa agreed to prepare a detailed proposal for inspector training focused on international fisheries, RFMO procedures, and monitoring, control, and surveillance (MCS) capacity building. The Executive Secretary is requested to facilitate and forward this request to the DSF Project during the coming year.

8. Approval of the Provisional 2026 Budget and 2027 forecast Budget

The Executive Secretary presented an overview of the provisional 2026 and the 2027 forecast budgets (DOC/SCAF/06/2025-v1(18 Oct 25)) and the explanatory notes (DOC/SCAF/07/2025-v1(18 Oct 25)).

EU praised the budget preparation, noting the overall increase aligns with Namibia's inflation rate and emphasized this alignment with inflation rates is a priority for the EU across all RFMOs.

The SCAF accepted the proposed 3,44 % increase of the staff salaries to accommodate the inflation rate in Namibia which was noted to be an average for the period from September 2024 to August 2025.

The interest of NAD 548,389 received over the past 12 months (Sep 2024 to Aug 2025) on the Unit trust investment was deducted from the proposed budget.

SCAF agreed to the budget for 2026 amounting to NAD 3,270,656.99 which is an increase of 3.6% of the 2025 budget.

<u>ACTION:</u> SCAF agreed to the provisional budget for 2026 of NAD 3,270,656.99 and the forecast budget for 2027 of NAD 3,390,113.31 (<u>Appendix III</u>) and recommends that the Commission approves the budget.

9. Contributions by Parties

Contributions by Parties were calculated for the agreed budget amounting to NAD 3,270,656.99 (<u>Appendix IV</u>). SCAF agreed to the contributions for 2026 and recommends that the Commission approves the Contributions by Parties.

ACTION: SCAF agreed to the contributions for 2026 and recommends that the Commission approves the Contributions by Parties.

10. Venue and date of next meeting

The next SCAF meeting will coincide with the next Commission meeting and will therefore be decided by the Commission.

11. Adoption of the 2025 SCAF Report

SCAF reviewed and adopted the meeting report to be presented by the Chair to the Commission.

12. Closure of meetings

The Chairperson closed the meeting at 15:20 on the 25th of November 2025. He thanked the delegations for their contributions and the Secretariat for their contribution.
