

1. Opening and welcome remarks by the Chairperson

The 16th Annual Meeting of the SEAFO Scientific Committee (SC) was conducted by correspondence from the 17th to 18th November 2020 with only the most important issues on the agenda. The Chairperson, Mr. Åge Høines opened the meeting officially on the 17th November at 09:00 (GMT+1) by email.

2. Appointment of Rapporteur

The Secretariate was appointed as rapporteur.

3. Adoption of agenda and meeting arrangements

SC adopted the agenda (Appendix I) with the following amendment:

• An additional agenda point was added for "Any other matters" (after agenda point 10) on request from Japan. Norway and South Africa.

Members were informed of the practical arrangements for the meeting by the Executive Secretary and the Chairperson.

4. Introduction of Delegates

Thirteen Scientific Committee members were registered for the 16th SEAFO SC meeting (see <u>Appendix II</u> for list of participants). No members from The Republic of Korea and the EU was registered.

5. Review 2020 work program

This agenda point was not discussed during the correspondence meeting. The Executive Secretary will send out reminder emails at the beginning of 2021 to remind the responsible members of the various tasks (after the list was updated) to be completed for the next SC meeting.

SC listed the following tasks for 2020 during the 2019 SC meeting:

• Continue work by the working group (Secretariat, Namibia and EU) to collect and collate all available orange roughy data and analyse CPUE.

• Collect samples of orange roughy in the Namibian EEZ, South African EEZ and SEAFO CA for genetic comparison at the University of Stellenbosch. Mr. Granville Louw to draft a guideline protocol for the collection and storage of genetics samples.

- Task team to prepare the survey plan for the 2020 EAF Nansen Survey and to give feedback from the 2019 & 2020 Nansen surveys (final and preliminary reports, respectively) at the next SC meeting.
- South Africa to continue with the orange roughy data (catch depths & length frequencies) analysis for catches recorded in the EEZ.
- Draft guidelines for using scientific data (video footage & survey counts) in the determination of threshold limits of VME encounters in relation to guidelines in other RFMOs and scientific bodies assigned to ES.

6. Report by the ES presenting landing tables

The Executive Secretary presented landings data which was received by the Secretariat between 1 October 2019 and 31 September 2020.

All retained and discarded catches are presented in the landings tables (DOC/SC/03/2020). The landing tables was edited and corrected by the SC.

SC noted that the figures includes data for one vessel that fished in the CA during 2020 which is a vessel from the Patagonian toothfish longline fishery. By the end of September 2020 data was received of landings of 37 tonnes (13.5 %) of the 275 tonnes TAC set for Sub-Area D.

Another toothfish longline vessel's data were submitted at the end of October 2020 and is not included in this report and a deep-sea crab vessel intends to start fishing towards the end of November 2020. Landings for those two vessels will be included in the landing tables for 2021.

Updates have been made to the 2019 landing figures from a toothfish longline vessel that fished during October 2019 and was not included in the 2019 landings tables.

SC members request the ES to use a comma every three digits to display the landing figures and two digits after the last comma for bycatch weight in Kg.

Japan requested that Logsheet data should be used instead of Observer data and that the landing should be updated for previous years where Observer data was used.

7. Review spatial and temporal distribution of fishing activity and biological data

The spatial distribution maps for fishing data received from 1 October 2019 to 31 September 2020, as well as the biological data tables, were provided by the Secretariat (DOC/SC/04/2020).

The SC reviewed the spatial and temporal maps provided by the Secretariat and corrections were made to the document.

8. Review the spatial distribution of reported catches of benthic organisms (corals, sponges, etc.)

The SC reviewed the updated data on incidental catches of VME species for fishing data received from 1 October 2019 to 31 September 2020 from the bottom longline fishery (see Tables 23-39 of DOC/SC/03/2020 for data on VME catches).

The SC reviewed the spatial distribution maps provided by the Secretariat.

Glass sponges were added to the list of VME indicators and should be discussed at the next SC meeting for consideration.

9. Review the Stock Status Reports

During the 2019 SC meeting, tasks were assigned to various members to update the Stock Status reports intersessionally. No discussion was done during the correspondence meeting. The Executive Secretary will send reminder emails early in 2021 to the members responsible for the tasks below to be ready for the 2021 meeting.

See the tasks listed below:

- Patagonian toothfish: Make length-frequency graphs more legible, align x-axes for all graphs and include modal length on individual graphs to easily view size changes across years – assigned to Dr. Tsutomu Nishida. (DONE)
- ALL STOCKS STATUS REPORTS: Standardize maps across Stock Status Reports (preferably design an R-script for catch positions and hexagonal aggregations of catch totals per year) assigned to Mr. Erich Maletzky.
- ALL STOCKS STATUS REPORTS: Standardize referencing across Stock Status Reports assigned to Executive Secretary. (Referencing was send to members. Will be sent during 2021 again as reminder)
- STOCKS STATUS REPORTS: Update & validate Alfonsino (BYS) Stock Status Reports catch maps and tables (3, 4 & 5) assigned to Dr. Arved Staby. (DONE)
- STOCKS STATUS REPORTS: Standardize and update all tables in the Pelagic armourhead (EDR) Stock Status Reports – assigned to Mr. Granville Louw.

10. Review Total Allowable Catches and related Management conditions for Patagonian toothfish, Alfonsino, Pelagic armourhead, Orange roughy and Deep-sea Red Crab.

The SC was supposed to conduct the biennial review the TACs for the usual five species during this meeting. It was however agreed to keep the TAC and management conditions unchanged for the 2021 fishing season from the 2019-2020 period and to review it during the next physical meeting.

10.1 Orange roughy

Zero tonnes and a 4 tonnes bycatch allowance in Division B1, and 50 tonnes in the remainder of the SEAFO CA subject to exploratory fishing protocols.

10.2 Deep-sea red crab

171 tonnes in Division B1 and 200 tonnes in the remainder of the Convention Area.

10.3 Patagonian toothfish

275 tonnes for Sub-area D and zero tonnes for the remainder of the SEAFO CA.

10.4 Alfonsino

200 tonnes for the SEAFO CA of which a maximum of 132 tonnes may be taken in Division B1;

10.5 Southern boarfish/ Pelagic armourhead

135 tonnes for the SEAFO CA.

RECOMMENDATION: All TACs and Management conditions to stay the same for 2021 as for the previous two years (2019-2020).

11. Any Other Matters

Japan plans to conduct the exploratory fishing in 2021. "Notice of Intent according to (CM30-15)" will be circulated to the SC and the Commission via the Secretariat for intersessional evaluations.

The SC would like to express the necessity of having a representative from the EU on the SC, as it is important that matters pertaining to catch -, bycatch - and biological data can be addressed and discussed with a representative of a member country directly.
